

New Age layout

llow me", says Birgit Schnaase, as we enter the saloon, "Orient meets Art Deco." The Hamburgbased interior designer is evidently proud as she welcomes us on board 46-metre "Mystic" in Cannes' Vieux Port - CMB's composite yacht is currently her longest LOA reference. However Schnaase not only designed just the interior for the Antalya-based builder's debut project. The "Mystic" style is intended to be a point of reference for future CMB yachts, a "signature style", as the designer and the owners, the Basaran family, term it. "You should be able to recognise its Turkish roots," Schnaase explains and points out the gold marquetry on sideboards, massive chandeliers, dark macassar wood, art deco patterns on the upholstery and cushions or the gleaming Lurex threads in the carpets. A great job and the workmanship is really quite superb.

As far as layout is concerned the Basarans, who not only export yachts but also Turkish nuts, in particular, went for quite unconventional solutions.

We have already encountered separate dining rooms on yachts of a similar size, but in contrast we have never seen a cinema on the main deck. Where many owners prefer to locate their offices, i.e. behind the lobby to starboard, on board "Mystic" you can watch the latest Hollywood or Bollywood productions from the comfort of three two-seaters.

Gym instead of owner's suite

The next surprise awaits in the direction of the bow. The standard location for the owner's suite is occupied by a spacious gym, complete with shower, sauna and massage bench. "Potential owners'

opinions differ here", Birgit Schnaase admits. "However if we go one deck up, the reasoning for the gym being where it is accepted straightaway." Instead of forward on the main deck, the owner is accommodated behind the bridge in a very spacious suite, which occupies at least half the deck. The office-entrance is adjoined by a dressing room that extends across the yacht's full beam. The bed is positioned well aft and there is access to the private terrace and views of the sea or the marina. Despite the emphasis on privacy in "Mystic's" layout, guests are most welcome - typically Turkish. How do you spot the tell-tale signs? The beds in the twin-cabins are extremely wide, for example ...
