Hakvoort lands 48m Atlantis order

Close on the heels of the departure for Monaco of its biggest build to date, Hakvoort has announced its latest commission, a 47.6m displacement motor yacht in steel with an aluminium superstructure designed for long-distance cruising. Atlantis, as she's to be called, will be just 3m short of the Dutch family-owned yard's JeMaSa, which departed Monnickendam in May for Monaco.

The modern JeMaSa, with naval architecture by Diana Yacht Design, exterior styling by Espen Øino Design and interior styling by Michela Reverberi and Barbara Barry, contrasts with Hakvoort's latest commission. Atlantis will have a range of 3,800nm at 12.5knots provided by twin MTU 500kW diesels and a fuel tank capacity of 68,400 litres. Good technical accessibility and low maintenance, both on deck and in the engine room, were part of the design brief and the

yacht will have three control stations – one inside the bridge and one on each of the bridge wings – along with an emergency station near the steering gear.

With her watertight bulkheads and double-bottom tank construction she is also certified under Lloyd's \$100A1



to special service craft level.

The new yacht will be the first commission under the leadership of brothers Klaas and Albert Havoort Jnr. They took over from their father, also Albert, who semi-retired in May after 50 years' service in the company that has been in his family since 1919.

Meanwhile work continues on two other builds at Monnickendam for delivery next year. Yard number 241. motor vacht Trust, should have her steel hull and aluminium superstructure completed this August with delivery scheduled for next September. Architecture for this extended charter yacht is by Diana Yacht Design, while the exterior styling is by Cor de Rover and interior by Felix Buytendijk. From a regulatory perspective she's significant as the first yacht to be built for charter under new Dutch CCV (Commercial Cruising Vessel) rules.

Also under construction is another

charter candidate, the 38m motor yacht Perle Bleue. A Diana Yacht Design/Donald Starkey naval architecture, design and styling combination, she was ordered by the former owner of the Cayman Islandsflagged, Hakvoort-built Campbell Bay.

Also at the yard in June was an extensive refit of *Happy Dolphin* (left), a 40m motor yacht constructed in Turkey for a Malaysian owner:

Commenting on the breadth of work now carried out at his family's yard, director Albert Hakvoort Jnr says: 'Four years ago the style was all classical. But now there is no longer a typical Hakvoort style.' RG

The second is the 102m Project Marco Polo by Camillo Costantini, an offthe-shelf design combining a retro and modern style with a strong Italian identity. The largest yacht is the 115m Project Morpheus by Tim Heywood, intended to be a timeless contemporary classic yacht. The company recently announced the signing of its first order: hull 6154, a 130m motor yacht developed by the Fincantieri Yachts team from a revolutionary new design by Espen Oeino. It is scheduled for delivery in 2010.

DARSE NORD AIR CONDITIONED TENT Hakvoort builds motor yachts and sailing yachts up to 50m and has purpose-built facilities for major refits. Its stand will be in the Dutch village organised by HISWA, where a model and photographs of the brand new 49.9m motor yacht JeMaSA will be on display. The shipyard's order book includes a 38m, 45m and 47.6m motor yacht and a 40m refit, so it's busy for a yard that can only build two boats at the same time. Sold in April to an American client, the 47.6m will have exterior styling and interior design by Glade Johnson, while Diana Yacht Design will handle the naval architecture. It will be built to Lloyds/MCA, will feature a four-storey lift from the guest deck to the sky lounge, and have an unusual layout with the entire bridge deck being dedicated to the owner's quarters, with captain, stores, galley, crew mess forward

on the main deck.
